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City of Orange Public Libraries **REALLY are FREE!**

The Orange Public Library Foundation works to meet the unfunded needs of the Orange Public Libraries (OPL), and it's free to use the library when you sign up for a free library card. Think about it: There aren't many truly *free* public places left in America. Most of our shared spaces require money, or a certain social status, and a paid membership to access. Malls exist to sell people things. Museums discourage loiterers. Coffee shops expect patrons to purchase a drink or snack if they want to enjoy the

premises. One place, though, remains open to everybody. The public library requires nothing of its visitors: no purchases, no membership fees, no dress code, and it gives patrons free use of books and technology along with many other educational tools.

Take a look to see some of the incredible things the Library Foundation is doing with the help of our generous donors and faithful volunteers as we work to make sure that the Orange Public Libraries remain FREE for everyone.

Do you know what the Orange Public Library Offers?

With the Foundation's help, the Orange Public Library is able to offer many different and surprising items to check out. Aside from the thousands and thousands of books offered for check-out every single day, there are many other amazing opportunities at our three public library branches.

Are you going on a hike soon or headed up to the mountains? Why not check out a GoPro camera to capture the memories? Or instead of a GoPro, maybe you want to take the kids out to the desert to gaze at the stars. Then you might like to check out a Telescope Kit.

How about a S.E.L.F. kit? The nine Social Emotional Learning for Families kits include subjects like anxiety, mindfulness, grief, and resilience. Parents can check out these kits and help their children learn new skills. Other kits available for borrowing are Alzheimer's/dementia, citizenship, mental health, early literacy, and teen discovery.

Homework centers now have scheduled time for students in grades 1-6 to come by and get homework help. Additionally, residents can reserve a study room for themselves and/or a small study group session.

Something else that might surprise you: why buy what you can grow? Seed packets are available for free at all three branches. The Foundation uses volunteers to sort bulk seeds into small packs that you can take home and plant yourself. Anything from corn and calendulas to sweet peppers, strawberries, and luffas can be panted from seeds received from the Orange Seed Lending Library.

Curious about specific historical events in our community? You must make a visit to the History Center at the Main Library. Maybe one of the best "things" to check out from the Library is a ukulele, and then join the "Ukulele Soup" jam sessions offered monthly. Everything that our libraries offer, including the activities calendar, is always listed on the library's website. Come by for a visit to one of our three incredible Orange Public Library branches.

For over eight years OPLF, in partnership with Orange Home Grown, has been packaging seeds for the Orange Seed Lending Library. Visit any of the three library branches to pick out free seeds to start your home garden. We estimate nearly 10,000 gardens have been started from the seeds the NCL volunteers have packaged for distribution.





On Thursdays during the hot month of July, the Library Foundation has a showing of popular family movies for the youth of Orange and their families to enjoy in the air-conditioned community room. The Family Film Fest is free to anyone who wants to attend, thanks to OPLF funding.
